This report, prepared pursuant to section 20(5) of the Social Services Law (SSL), concerns: A report made to the New York Statewide Central Register of Child Abuse and Maltreatment (SCR) involving the death of a child.
The death of a child for whom child protective services has an open case.
The death of a child whose care and custody or custody and guardianship has been transferred to an authorized agency.
The death of a child for whom the local department of social services has an open preventive service case.

The Office of Children and Family Services (OCFS) is mandated by section 20 of the SSL to investigate or cause for the investigation of the cause and circumstances surrounding the death, review such investigation, and prepare and issue a fatality report in regard to the categories of deaths noted above involving a child, except where a local or regional fatality review team issues a report, as authorized by law.

Such report must include: the cause of death; the identification of child protective or other services provided or actions taken regard to such child and child's family; any extraordinary or pertinent information concerning the circumstances of the child's death; whether the child or the child's family received assistance, care or services from the social services district prior to the child's death; any action or further investigation undertaken by OCFS or the social services district since the child's death; and as appropriate, recommendations for local or state administrative or policy changes.

This report contains no information that would identify the deceased child, his or her siblings, the parent, parents, or other persons legally responsible for the child, and any members of the deceased child's household.

By statute, this report will be forwarded to the social services district, chief county executive officer, chairperson of the local legislative body of the county where the child died and the social services district that had legal custody of the child, if different. Notice of the issuance of this report will be sent to the Speaker of the Assembly and the Temporary President of the Senate of the State of New York.

This report may <u>only</u> be disclosed to the public by OCFS pursuant to section 20(5) of the SSL. It may be released by OCFS only after OCFS has determined that such disclosure is not contrary to the best interests of the deceased child's siblings or other children in the household.

OCFS' review included an examination of actions taken by individual caseworkers and supervisors within the social services district and agencies under contract with the social services district. The observations and recommendations contained in this report reflect OCFS' assessment and the performance of these agencies.

Presenting Information

Warren County Department of Social Services (WCDSS) received an SCR report on 11/11/20 which alleged that on 11/10/20 around 10:00 PM, the mother (SM) went to sleep in an adult bed with the 5-day-old subject child (SC) and 4-year-old sibling (SS). The mother awoke at approximately 2:00 AM and found the subject child not breathing in bed with her. The mother called 911 and began CPR. The child was transported by EMS to the hospital where she was pronounced dead at 3:10 AM. The child had no visible injuries and was otherwise healthy at the time of her death. The father (SF) was present in the home and asleep in another room at the time of the fatal incident.

Executive Summary

This report concerns the death of a 5-day-old child. At the time of the child's death, she resided with her mother, father, and 4-year-old sibling. The sibling was assessed as safe in the care of the mother and father throughout the investigation period.

WCDSS received the SCR report and initiated their investigation into the fatal incident. It was learned through interviews with law enforcement and the parents that on the night of the fatal incident, the child was asleep in the adult bed with the mother and the 4-year-old sibling. The child had been placed to sleep on a u-shaped infant pillow, commonly referred to as a "Boppi" pillow with a blanket by the mother. The mother then fell asleep and awoke at approximately 2:00 AM to find the child unresponsive. The father, who was asleep in the other room, was awoken by the mother and called 911 and live saving interventions were attempted. First responders arrived at the home and transported the child to the hospital, where she was pronounced dead.

The coroner listed the cause of death as "unable to be determined with a history of co-sleeping with a parent and sibling." Law enforcement investigated the fatal incident and determined no criminal charges would be pressed against the mother.

WCDSS interviewed all familial and relevant collateral contacts during the investigation into the fatal incident. WCDSS obtained birth records and the records showed the mother and father had knowledge of safe sleep practices and signed paperwork affirming their knowledge. WCDSS reviewed manufacturer information for the Boppi pillow which directly states the pillow should not be used when the infant is sleeping or without parental supervision. WCDSS made the determination to unsubstantiate the allegation of DOA/Fatality against the mother and to substantiate the allegations of Inadequate Guardianship against the mother and the father. The parents were aware of safe sleep protocols and disclosed that they co-slept with the children on a regular basis. Information for grief counseling was provided to the family and the investigation was closed.

LDSS Response

WCDSS received the SCR report and coordinated their response with law enforcement (LE). LE informed WCDSS that co-sleeping was a factor in the SC's death. LE informed WCDSS that the SM was asleep in the bed with the SC. An autopsy was performed, and the preliminary results were consistent with the SM rolling over on the SC while asleep.

WCDSS conducted a home visit to interview the members of the household on 11/12/20. The SM stated that on the night of the incident, the SF was asleep on the couch and that she had fed the SC and put her to sleep on the bed on a Boppi pillow between herself and the SS. The SM stated that SC was on her back in the Boppi with a blanket underneath them. The SC also slept with a blanket below her waist. The SM stated she awoke at approximately 2:00 AM and noticed the SC did not look right. The SM picked up the SC and brought her to the other room to wake the SF. The SF called 911 and the SM began to perform CPR until EMS arrived at the home. The SM stated that she found the SC in the same position she was placed to sleep in and that she was warm and limp when found. The SM and the SF both identified knowledge of safe sleep practices and stated that they co-slept with the SS and did not believe something like this would happen to them. The SM and SF declined to take a drug screen when requested by WCDSS and stated they were both sober at the time of the fatal incident. The 4-year-old SS was interviewed by WCDSS. The SS offered no additional information regarding the fatal incident and was assessed as safe in the care of the SM and the SF. WCDSS offered the family bereavement and burial assistance. The family declined services with the understanding they could engage later if they wanted.

The EMS first responders who responded to the scene were interviewed by WCDSS. WCDSS were informed that upon their arrival, the SC was cyanotic in color and there were no signs of life. CPR was continued until their arrival at the hospital.

The SF had a 14-year-old child with another mother who visited the home occasionally. The 14-year-old sibling had no direct knowledge of the fatal incident and was assessed as safe in the care of his biological mother. WCDSS offered services to the sibling, which were declined.

WCDSS followed up with LE prior to closing the investigation. LE informed WCDSS that no charges would be filed, and the criminal investigation was closed.

WCDSS obtained birth records from the hospital for the SC. The records confirmed that the SM and SF watched a video on safe sleep practices and signed paperwork acknowledging that they had received the information.

Pediatrician records were obtained for both the SC and the SS. No concerns had been present for either child prior to the death of the SC.

Autopsy results were obtained from the office of the coroner. The cause of death was listed as "unable to be determined with a history of infant co-sleeping with an adult and child." The manner of death was undetermined.

WCDSS reviewed the manufacturer information for the Boppi pillow. The manufacturers website specifically states the pillow is not to be used when the infant is sleeping or unsupervised by an adult.

WCDSS provided the family with information on bereavement counseling prior to closing the investigation. WCDSS assessed that the SS was safe in the care of the SM and the SF throughout the investigation period. At the conclusion of the investigation, WCDSS determined that there was enough credible evidence to substantiate the allegations of Inadequate Guardianship against the SM and the SF due to their knowledge of safe sleep practices and inappropriate use of the Boppi pillow.
