This report, prepared pursuant to section 20(5) of the Social Services Law (SSL), concerns:  A report made to the New York Statewide Central Register of Child Abuse and Maltreatment (SCR) involving the death of a child.
The death of a child for whom child protective services has an open case.
The death of a child whose care and custody or custody and guardianship has been transferred to an authorized agency.
The death of a child for whom the local department of social services has an open preventive service case.

The Office of Children and Family Services (OCFS) is mandated by section 20 of the SSL to investigate or cause for the investigation of the cause and circumstances surrounding the death, review such investigation, and prepare and issue a fatality report in regard to the categories of deaths noted above involving a child, except where a local or regional fatality review team issues a report, as authorized by law.

Such report must include: the cause of death; the identification of child protective or other services provided or actions taken regard to such child and child's family; any extraordinary or pertinent information concerning the circumstances of the child's death; whether the child or the child's family received assistance, care or services from the social services district prior to the child's death; any action or further investigation undertaken by OCFS or the social services district since the child's death; and as appropriate, recommendations for local or state administrative or policy changes.

This report contains no information that would identify the deceased child, his or her siblings, the parent, parents, or other persons legally responsible for the child, and any members of the deceased child's household.

By statute, this report will be forwarded to the social services district, chief county executive officer, chairperson of the local legislative body of the county where the child died and the social services district that had legal custody of the child, if different. Notice of the issuance of this report will be sent to the Speaker of the Assembly and the Temporary President of the Senate of the State of New York.

This report may <u>only</u> be disclosed to the public by OCFS pursuant to section 20(5) of the SSL. It may be released by OCFS only after OCFS has determined that such disclosure is not contrary to the best interests of the deceased child's siblings or other children in the household.

OCFS' review included an examination of actions taken by individual caseworkers and supervisors within the social services district and agencies under contract with the social services district. The observations and recommendations contained in this report reflect OCFS' assessment and the performance of these agencies.

### **Presenting Information**

An SCR report was received on 11/9/18 which alleged the 2-month-old subject child was found cold, blue, and unresponsive in his crib three hours after his mother placed him down for a nap. The mother called 911, and the child was transported to the hospital where he was pronounced deceased. The child had no preexisting medical conditions that would have contributed to his death. The roles of the father and the 1-year-old surviving sibling were unknown.

### **Executive Summary**

This fatality report concerns the death of a 2-month-old subject child that occurred on 11/8/19. A report was made to the SCR on 11/9/18, with allegations of Inadequate Guardianship and DOA/Fatality against the child's mother. Onondaga County Department of Social Services (OCDSS) received the report and investigated the child's death. An autopsy was completed and both the cause and manner of death were ruled "Undetermined."

At the time of the child's death, he resided with his mother, father, and 1-year-old brother. It was discovered on the evening of 11/8/18, the family was at home and the mother placed the child on his stomach in his crib at approximately 6PM. There were two baby blankets in the crib with the child as he slept. Several hours later, the sibling went to bed, and the mother went to check on the subject child. She found the child face down and unresponsive in his crib. The mother yelled for the father and began cardiopulmonary resuscitation while the father called 911. An ambulance arrived at the home and transported the child to the hospital where he was pronounced deceased. An official time of death was not recorded in the medical documentation or case record; however, it was noted EMS responded to the home at 11:39PM.

From the time the investigation began to the time of its closure, OCDSS met with the mother, father, and surviving sibling. OCDSS observed the home and the sibling on several occasions and found no safety concerns. Further, OCDSS spoke with many collateral sources and offered the family appropriate referrals for services in response to the subject child's death. There were no criminal charges pursued against either parent. Sufficient evidence was gathered to substantiate the Inadequate Guardianship allegation; however, OCDSS unsubstantiated. OCDSS unfounded the report and closed.

#### **LDSS Response**

On 11/9/18, OCDSS received the SCR report regarding the death of the subject child, which occurred on 11/8/18. OCDSS initiated their investigation of the reported fatality within 24 hours and coordinated their efforts with their Multidisciplinary Team. OCDSS learned there was a surviving sibling and promptly assessed his safety; no concerns were noted.

On the date the report was received, OCDSS and Law Enforcement went to the hospital where the subject child was brought by ambulance and interviewed family members. The mother and father explained the child was acting normally throughout the day and he was put down in his crib around 6PM. The mother stated she always placed the child on his stomach to sleep, despite knowing he should be placed on his back; she reported the child was not comfortable sleeping on his back. The mother stated she laid the child sideways in the crib and then went downstairs to cook dinner. Several hours later, she went to check on the child and found he was still face down in the crib. The mother stated she picked the child up and he was pale and blue. She explained she screamed for the father, and he called 911 while the mother began CPR until EMS arrived. Although the notes did not reflect what time the mother went to check on the child, the 911 call was noted to have been placed at 11:34PM. The parents explained the sibling was asleep during this incident.

On this same date, OCDSS and Law Enforcement completed a joint home visit and noted no safety concerns. OCDSS observed the crib in which the child slept, and it was empty. OCDSS was later informed by the Medical Examiner that the child was placed to sleep on top of a "baby comforter and a baby blanket."



Throughout the investigation, OCDSS made several home visits to assess the safety of the surviving sibling and spoke with many collateral sources including Law Enforcement, the Medical Examiner, and hospital staff. The children's pediatrician was also contacted, and OCDSS was informed both children were up to date medically with no concerns. The final autopsy noted the manner of death and cause of death as "Undetermined." Appropriate service referrals were offered to the family. Although evidence was found to substantiate the allegation of Inadequate Guardianship due to the mother placing the child in an unsafe sleeping environment, OCSDS unsubstantiated all allegations and closed the case.
